While Rapunzel laments her imprisonment in a tower, the witch Thalia tries to do her own good. Afraid to go outside, Thalia fears the knights are coming to harm them. When a persistent man continues to speak to Rapunzel, Thalia knows she must do something to help him. With her hair growing longer, it will only be a matter of time before he can reach her. Vowing to keep a promise she made sixteen years earlier, Thalia makes a decision that could change everything. Grimm's Fairy Tales is a German collection of fairy tales by the Grimm brothers, Jacob and Wilhelm, first published on 20 December 1812. The Grimm anthology has been a source of inspiration for artists and composers. The Grimms believed that the most natural and pure forms of culture were linguistic and based in history. The work of the Brothers Grimm influenced other collectors, both inspiring them to collect tales and leading them to similarly believe, in a spirit of romantic nationalism, that the fairy tales of a country were particularly representative of it, to the neglect of cross-cultural influence.
