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paying too much for a stock and clues the investor in to the likely return from buying growth.

Strikingly, the analysis finesses the need to calculate a "cost-of-capital," which often frustrates the application of modern valuation techniques.

Accounting for value recasts "value" versus "growth" investing and explains such curiosities as why earnings-to-price and book-to-price ratios

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predict stock returns.
